Stay Safe During Winter



Don't Let Your Pipes Freeze

Pipes that freeze most frequently are pipes that are exposed to severe cold such as:

- water supply pipes in unheated interior areas like basements & crawl spaces, attics, garages or kitchen cabinets
- pipes that run against interior walls with little to no insulation

Here are a few tips for preventing frozen pipes:

- keep your garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage
- open kitchen & bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing
- if you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F
